




2022-2023 School Year Impact

By any measure, 2022-2023 was extraordinary for PeerForward.



We enjoyed our first year of a partnership with the NBA Foundation, continued working with new high school partners in Kentucky, Hawaii, and Bermuda. And we saw more promising results from our new PeerForward in College program. PeerForward's profile was raised in media coverage on The Today Show and in The New York Times Magazine, Education Week, and others. PeerForward's expertise in assisting students in low-income communities navigate their way to and through college.

We are proud to offer this 2022-2023 review.




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Earned a Bachelors Degree by Age 26


The pandemic only exacerbated the gap, especially for community colleges that serve a majority of Black, Latinx, and low-income students.

PeerForward in High School

PeerForward's work is more urgent than ever. While high school students continue to recover from pandemic set- backs, a new potential hurdle arose when the U.S. Supreme Court ruled affirmative action unlawful. The decision introduced a great deal of uncertainty in the admissions season, but PeerForward remained true to its work. The organization began to assist students with admissions essays. While the model has evolved, PeerForward continues to provide every Peer Leader with an essay coach – something parents of means pay thousands for (further perpetuating an unequal system). During summer training, all Peer Leaders were coached in writing their own essay and how to coach their friends to do the same.

PeerForward in College

PeerForward's newest program operates in two- and four-year colleges serving Black, Latino, Indigenous, and low-income students to improve degree attainment. Trained Peer Leaders execute three campaigns to get classmates to take steps proven to increase chances of persistence to a degree: access academic support opportunities, stay on track with financial aid, and engage with campus communities and activities. Each Peer Leader mentors a roster of fellow students who are identified and recruited by the college. Peer Leaders are paid through AmeriCorps, College Work Study or other programs. Our results are strong.
